Order and brotherly love keynoted the 1962 Passover and Days of Unleavened Bread here in the Chicago-Midwest Area. In the words of Mr. Dean Blackwell, Pastor over this area of God's Church, "This was the most orderly Passover I have ever seen for this number of people." With Evangelist, Roderick C. Meredith as visiting speaker, and a grand total of ten of God's servants, to instruct, admonish and correct us, it was to be expected that the assemblage would be respectful and attentive.

The combined Feast Days were held in three separate halls this year: The Keyman's Club, and the Electricians' Hall, both near Madison and Cicero, and the Logan Square Masonic Temple.

A sober, soul-searching group of 614 took the Passover on Tuesday night. These baptized members of the Church of God had come from many midwestern states and Canada to be present for this most meaningful occasion. After the thought-provoking ceremony conducted by Mr. Blackwell and Mr. Meeker, Minister of the Milwaukee Church, the congregation quietly retired to their homes to think upon the great sacrifice made for us by Jesus Christ.



With the arrival of Mr. Meredith during the Bible study on Friday afternoon, came greetings from the Pasadena area. Despite a very rough flight (by jet) he was ready to give us a sermon on the Sabbath. Mr. Harold Jackson, the only colored elder in God's work, told us of his having conducted the Passover in Meridian, Miss, for 28 colored brethren who attended the feast day there. Accompanying Mr. and Mrs. Jackson on their trip was Mr. Sanders Ray, an outstanding member of the Chicago Spokesman Club. One of the men who has come along in the Spokesman Club to the point that he might be a help among the scattered colored people.

Mr. Meredith's first sermon was on "Why We, God's People, Are Together" —celebrating, unlike the rest of the world, and set apart from the world. In the afternoon, Mr. Meredith's talk was on "Leadership Development". Rounding out a full Sabbath was Mr. Blackwell's "God Is A Family," which he showed us that one of the major problems among the people was a lack of **persistency** in striving toward the major goal of God's kingdom.

On Saturday evening, a social was held at the Masonic Temple, while the Negro brethren had one of their own at the Fiftieth Bridge Club. Theirs was doubly joyous in that it was also the wedding reception of Mr. and Mrs. Maceo Hampton, who had been married by Mr. Blackwell the previous Thursday evening.

The next morning, while the rest of the world was celebrating "Easter", God's people were rejoicing in another full day of instruction and feasting. Mr. Les McColm, minister of the South Bend area, spoke on "Spiritual Types" and how certain parallels may be drawn between the people of ancient Israel and today's Church. Mr. Meredith's sermon was "God's Holy Spirit and What it Can Do For Us". He expounded on the fact that the "Easter" celebrations deny the one true sign that Christ is the Messiah -that He was to be in the ground for three days and three nights, and then he went on to tell just what God's holy spirit is and how it should be used.

At noon, the group partook of the feast meal together. Mr. Hal Baird, who had taken an early morning plane from St. Louis, where he had conducted festival services, delivered a very helpful sermon telling "Nine Ways to Put Sin Out of Your Life". He told how to start the day right, how to plan because

"There is time for every purpose under the heaven" Ecc. 3:1. Mr. Blackwell followed with a sermon on "Security in Sins", showing three ways people are inclined to harbor sins in their lives and what should be done about it.

Sunday evening, the Walt Disney color film, "The Living Desert", was shown to all who wished to stay for even more fellowshipping and entertaining instruction.

Wednesday morning dawned bright and sunny and God's people met in the attractive Electricians' Hall for the final festival dav. In his opening sermonette, Mr. Meeker admonished us all to "Make a Continual Effort". Mr. Blackwell showed "How God Guides His Church" and how more members should addict themselves to the ministry of the saints, this being the important thing in life.

Once again a sumptuous physical meal, served at noon, was enjoyed by all. Beginning the afternoon meetings, Mr. Jackson talked on "Reaching God Through Prayer." For his final sermon, Mr. Meredith delivered: "We Are Here to Become Like God" and showed us four ways we can accomplish this: "By searching for our sins; Truly acknowledging them and repenting; Doing battle against our weaknesses; and Walking with God". He commended the efforts of all God's servants in the many facets of their work in the Chicago Area. Although the actual sermons were over, the real work is just beginning for those who are striving to overcome and to attain the Kingdom of God.

Mr. Lowell Foster added his contribution to the afternoon's training by presenting, in his unique way, many thoughtprovoking topics. To name one: "How would a worsening of the steel crisis affect you?"

Our Toastmaster, Mr. Martin C. Filippello, brightened the meeting by telling jokes such as you have never heard before. Mr. Harold Krueger gave a challenging speech on "A Challenge": describing five points on which he works daily in order to overcome. Mr. John Wood carried us into the imaginationdefying, and limitless universe in his speech on "My Reply to Mr. Krushchev." Mr. Gene Scarbrough's speech on "Wildlife" gave us a spine-tingling new concept of the increase of wild animals in the present and very near future. And to ring down the curtain, the final speaker of the day was Mr. Larson of Milwaukee, adding to our knowledge with his revealing speech about The Prophet Jeremiah." Finally Mr. Blackwell sprang a startling surprise on many of our scattered visitors as well as some of the local brethren with his announcement that there would be as of May 1st, 1962, not one, not two, not three, but four Spokesman Clubs in the Chicago area.
