## Ministers confer in Britain

BRICKET WOOD, England — Ministers and other key personnel from Britain, Germany, Ireland, the Netherlands and Scandinavia were here June 26 and 27 for a ministerial conference on Ambassador College's former campus here directed by evangelists Leslie McCullough and Frank Brown.

Mr. McCullough, of Pasadena, is director of the International Division, and Mr. Brown is regional director of the British Work.

Two new preaching elders were ordained at the conference: David Stirk, pastor of the churches in northeast England, and John Meakin, soon to take up responsibilities as pastor of the churches in Scotland.

Mr. McCullough briefed those present on developments in the Work worldwide, updating everyone on recent personnel changes, the merger of the two U.S. Ambassador campuses and the result of Ambassador's attempt to gain accreditation.

Mr. Brown explained developments in the Work in this country over the last 12 months. Though, he said, certain activities have had to be curtailed for the British Work to become virtually self-supporting, much can be accomplished despite the limitations.

He also outlined the steps that have been taken to bring about full registration of the Worldwide Church of God in the United Kingdom. He expects registration soon.

The conference included many other discussions, and a lively round of social engagements enabled the ministers to get to know each other better.

Mr. McCullough flew from London to Johannesburg, South Africa, arriving here June 30 for meetings with the staff there.

## Just what is our mission?

In a sense what we call "the WORK" was started in October, 1933. In a wider sense — encompassing the NEED of it — WHY it was started — we have to go all the way back into prehistory, perhaps more than billions of years ago.

Does that smack of the evolutionary theory? Not at all. The evolutionists may start in antiquity of something like a hundred million years ago. But the REAL story of MAN — and WHY "the WORK," now a very large worldwide operation, exists — may have its beginnings as far back as a thousand trillion years ago, or even a thousand trillion TIMES a thousand trillion.

Seem crazy?  
NOT AT ALL. And without UNDERSTANDING this beginning — so far back in time your mind can't conceive of it — you can't really grasp what "the WORK" is, or comprehend its matchless IMPORTANCE! For it is in fact the MOST IMPORTANT operation on the face of the earth today!

Many times, in the past two or three years, I have written parts of this. Yet it can't be repeated too often, because it EXPLAINS the state of the world today (and nobody else is revealing it) — WHY humanity exists on the earth, WHY the human mind is so great it can send men to the moon and bring them safely back, yet WHY MAN cannot get along with man — WHY there is no PEACE on the earth.

### The only hope for peace

Just last evening a guest in my Pasadena home was the original glamour movie star — of the days when there really were GLAMOUR stars — Gloria Swanson. She asked, "Mr. Armstrong, do you agree with many of the world-famous scientists

who say the ONLY hope of world PEACE is one super WORLD GOVERNMENT?"

"Indeed I do," I answered. "But how is that POSSIBLE?" she asked. "There is no man on earth able to HEAD such a supercolossal WORLD GOVERNMENT. No man would be acceptable to ALL the present governments, most of them embroiled in wranglings, controversies or war."

"True," I smiled. And then I explained HOW it may be — really will be — brought about.

She shook her head slowly. "Yes," she said, "I guess that's the world's ONLY HOPE!"

I have in mind writing a critique — or a parallel in contrast — to H.G. Wells' famous book *Outline of History*.

His book starts out with such sentences as (and I am not quoting):

"We actually know NOTHING of this or that." "We may hazard a few GUESSES." or "Some have a theory that such and such may have happened." If what I am going to give you of REAL prehistoric beginnings — POSITIVE statements based on proven AUTHORITY — sounds strange, please do not think it more crazy than statements such as "we know nothing," or "some theorists

## Accreditation denied Ambassador; candidacy continued for two years

PASADENA — The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) has denied Ambassador College regional accreditation but has extended its status as a candidate for accreditation for two more years.

In a letter to Garner Ted Armstrong, received here June 20, WASC informed the college of its decision not to grant full accreditation.

Mr. Armstrong, commenting on the WASC decision in his "Personal" in this issue, said the association was concerned about the "interweaving of the Church and the college. I have had many lengthy discussions with my father following this action and have instituted many new procedures which we feel will continue the process of further development of Ambassador College along lines fully acceptable to the accrediting commission."

(Mr. Armstrong discusses the subject of accreditation more in his column.)

### Could apply sooner

College officials said that, while

candidacy status has been extended for two years, the college could reapply before the two years are up. They indicated a visit could be requested as early as the spring of 1978, with a decision from WASC received about a year from now.

A seven-person evaluation team from the Western Association, which was headed by Robert K. Thomas, academic vice president at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah, visited Ambassador March 21 to 23. The team's official report to WASC was reproduced in its entirety in the June 1 issue of *The Bulletin*, a publication for ministers and other administrative personnel of the college and Church.

The team made 13 general recommendations to Ambassador, which include the need for plans to alleviate space problems in the library and elsewhere, concern over the proportion of the budget devoted to physical plant and support services, faculty involvement in such areas as budget development, and the need to stabilize administrative rela-

tionships and titles.

However, the two key recommendations concerned separation of the Church and college and the board of trustees.

"Without abridging the present supportive relationship between Ambassador College and the Worldwide Church of God, a complete separation of Church and College must be established and maintained," the report said. "This would also make possible financial reporting more in line with standard college practice."

"... A program to help members of the Board of Trustees understand their duties should begin immediately and should be a continuing and explicit effort."

### Vice president optimistic

Ronald Kelly, who served as vice president and provost for the Big Sandy Ambassador campus and has been appointed vice president for student affairs at Pasadena, was disappointed but optimistic.

"Of course we were all disappointed that full accreditation was not granted at this time," he said. "However, on the positive side, candidacy was extended for a period of two years. And the most encouraging possibilities are that Ambassador College can be fully accredited at the conclusion of the 1977-78 school year."

## Canada YOU begins activities

TORONTO, Ont. — Though Youth Opportunities United has been a big part of activities of Church young people for some time now in the United States, YOU until recently didn't exist in Canada.

But times are changing. The first major YOU activity in the country, a track-and-field meet organized by the Toronto Region and national YOU director Norm Strayer June 12, played host to 225 entrants from 15 congregations and kicked off a major effort to get the Church's youth program going here.

"Although YOU has been started in the U.S., Canada has not organized any local chapters until quite recently," said Larry Greider, a minister and director of YOU's new Toronto Region. "Because of the smaller churches and larger areas involved, the decision was made to wait until a viable Canadian adaptation of the Church's youth program was established."

Canada, Mr. Greider said, is now divided into seven YOU regions, with eight coordinators (two for bilingual Montreal) for the chapters in their areas. The coordinators and

# A Personal Letter

from

*Samuel Lee Armstrong*

Dear brethren in Christ:

Greetings from Orr, Minn.! In only a couple of hours I will be speaking for the first time on the Sabbath before the full SEP camp just as it comes to its conclusion! The first group of about 360 campers will be sadly on their way home within the next few days, after a fantastically exciting three weeks at our beautiful summer camp up here in Orr.

On Sunday, July 10, a week from tomorrow, general manager and former coach of the Los Angeles Lakers Bill Sharman will arrive with his staff to conduct a five-day basketball camp here at which Kareem Abdul-Jabbar is slated to appear for at least one day.

The week following that the second session of SEP begins.

Having the opportunity to be here on a couple of occasions during the summer really deepens my resolve evermore of the great value this program is to the hundreds upon hundreds of Church young people from all over! We have never seen a more zealous group of young people; we have never had, taken as a whole, a better staff than this year!

We have all been shaking our heads in amazement at the fact that most of our problems have been little ones (with the exception of the measles scare early in the first camp) and have been very pleased at how

smoothly everything has gone.

Aside from the usual rash of minor incidents, such as scrapes, cuts and bruises, we have had no serious accidents of any kind, and of course we are all very thankful for that.

## Accreditation decision

I suppose the biggest news, which to many will be disappointing, is that the Western Association of Schools and Colleges voted (by a very narrow margin, we believe) to deny regional accreditation to Ambassador College for the present.

Some of the major points that were brought up were those involving the intertwining of the Church and the college.

I have had many lengthy discussions with my father following this action and have instituted many new procedures which we feel will continue the process of further development of Ambassador College along lines fully acceptable to the accrediting commission.

Perhaps I can explain it in reverse so many of you brethren who have visited the campus can understand.

Often, when brethren or co-workers come to the college campus, they are coming to what they feel is the headquarters of the Worldwide Church of God. It is almost as if, when one walks on the Ambassador College campus, one may look around and wonder,

"But where is the Church?"

Actually, since my father, as pastor general of the Worldwide Church of God, and myself, as executive vice president of the Church, occupy offices on the fourth floor of the Hall of Administration (yet my father is also chairman of the board of Ambassador College and I am the college's president), we both wear two hats in relationship to the Church and the college.

Further, since the Ambassador College Auditorium is also the major structure in the world so far as a Sabbath assembly is concerned, many people look to it as the "headquarters church."

This is where the confusion begins. I have said for well more than a decade that Ambassador College would ultimately be better served (and I have spoken very candidly of this both to the Western and the Southern associations) if we had a worldwide Church headquarters in one location and the educational arm of the Church — Ambassador College — in a separate location.

## Contiguous but separate

Years ago, foreseeing this eventuality, my father hoped to build a high-rise Church headquarters building, contiguous to but distinctly separate from the Ambassador College campus in Pasadena.

Because of the current financial strain on the Work to accomplish all of our most essential activities and yet avoid any more serious cash-flow crunches, we feel we cannot take on any additional debt-retirement programs brought about by major construction at this time. Otherwise we could solve this problem by the design and construction of a separate Church headquarters building somewhere near

# U.S. policy clouds Asia's future

PASADENA — U.S. Secretary of State Cyrus Vance, setting the stage for his coming trip to Peking, said June 29 that the Carter administration is committed to establishing normal diplomatic relations with the People's Republic of China, thus signaling the end of Washington's once-close ties to the Nationalist Chinese government on Taiwan.

The United States has gradually moved in the direction of a full relationship with the Communist Chinese ever since Richard Nixon's surprise visit to Peking in 1972. But up until now Washington has refrained from stating its intentions so openly.

## 'Swap of allegiance'

Taiwan's reaction to the Vance policy statement, which was emphasized by President Carter in his news conference the next morning, was predictably negative. What kind of relationship will remain between the United States and Taiwan after the "swap of allegiance" is made is uncertain. The United States is still committed, under the terms of a 1954 treaty, to guarantee militarily the independence of the Taiwan government. Will this now be scrapped? In his announcement Vance said that the United States places importance on the "peaceful settlement of the Taiwan question by the Chinese themselves."

However, it is extremely doubtful whether the two Chinas could ever peacefully settle their differences. Ever since the victory of Mao's forces on the mainland in 1949, and the fleeing of Chiang Kai-shek's government to its island fortress, the two Chinas have developed diametrically opposite societies. On the mainland the Communists have perfected the world's largest and most doctrinaire totalitarian society, based on classical Marxist-Leninism as in-

terpreted, of course, by the thought of Mao Tse-tung. Across the Formosa Strait, the Nationalists, on the other hand, have constructed a booming capitalist society, rivaling the Japanese for the title of Asia's economic miracle. The Nationalists, in addition to evolving a Western-style economy, have also become the repository of Chinese culture, having rescued in their exodus, 28 years ago, much of the art and other treasures of China's past.

## No way to reunite

On the mainland, again by contrast, the Red zealots, in their drive to create the "new communist man," have destroyed many links to China's heritage.

There is simply no way the two Chinas can now ever peacefully become reunited. They are as different as night and day; 28 years of accusations and recriminations flying across (literally, at times, in propaganda balloons) the Formosa Strait have created such a climate of ill will and mutual abhorrence that only war and total victory of one side over the other will solve the deep-rooted dispute.

The Nationalists, not without some logic, accuse the United States of being a turncoat on the recognition issue. How, they ask, can Washington abandon a free-world partner and embrace — especially now with the Carter administration's emphasis on human rights — the bosom of a regime that has perhaps been history's most flagrant abuser of human rights and dignity?

Last week I heard Taiwan's ambassador to the United States speak on this subject in Los Angeles. If the human-rights issue, James Shen asked, really is central to U.S. foreign policy, as the new administration claims, then how can Mr. Carter (as well as his predecessor) overlook that anywhere between 32 and 62 million Chinese have been "liquidated" on the mainland since the

Communists consolidated their power through successive waves of purges, "cultural revolutions" and other Marxist-Maoist purification drives since then? A hard question to answer, but, then, "human rights" really is a selective policy after all, and newly perceived U.S. national interests take precedence.

## Fair-weather Japan

Mr. Shen, despite his otherwise diplomatic demeanor, also leveled a frontal blow at the Japanese government when he remarked that Tokyo "went off on a cocked hat" when it abruptly switched its diplomatic ties from Taipei to Taiwan in 1972, in the aftermath of the Nixon trip.

Even though Japanese businessmen were present in the Biltmore Hotel audience, the blunt Mr. Shen added that "Japan is a fair-weather friend, not to be trusted."

Interesting currents of change are beginning to course through Asia. What the outcome will be no one can see right now. But one thing is certain: If the United States follows through on its new policy directions, such as recognizing Peking and pulling ground troops out of South Korea, we could see much more uncertainty and instability in the Pacific.

Up until now the United States has acted as the hub of the free Asian wheel, a nation the others could trust. With America changing tune, the Japanese, South Koreans, Taiwanese and Filipinos could rehear old rivalries and suspicions, which are always just below the surface anyway.

To assess firsthand the changing conditions in this vital part of the world, Keith Stump, one of my News Bureau assistants, and I will leave shortly for a three-week, six-nation tour of Asia. We hope to report to *Worldwide News* readers on our findings while traveling and again on our return.

# Why many don't understand Pentecost

**Do you realize thousands of WORLDWIDE CHURCH OF GOD members assembled on the Day of Pentecost who did not really understand what this Holy Day really MEANS? Test yourself. Read this article and see if YOU do.**

WE SIMPLY CAN'T understand WHY we observe the Day of Pentecost just by reading the scriptures that apply specifically to that day — or apply specifically to all of God's Festivals, for that matter.

You may read these specific scriptures alone and learn that you are COMMANDED to keep them. Actually that's what Mrs. Loma Armstrong and I did. Do you realize that we kept all these Holy Days *alone*, by ourselves, while the Church of God members we then knew and fellowshiped with (Sardis era; Revelation 3:1-6) "mocked us to scorn"?

**'Laughed to scorn'**

It was history repeating itself. King Hezekiah of Judah had discovered these days ought to be kept — after both Israel and Judah had ceased observing them for a long time. The Temple, at Jerusalem, through disuse had been filled with filth. Hezekiah had the Temple cleansed. He sent out proclamations to keep the Feasts of God. Judah did.

Hezekiah sent messengers up into Israel, the northern kingdom, from city to city in Ephraim and Manasseh, to teach them God's Holy Days must be kept. But "they laughed them to scorn, and mocked them" (II Chronicles 30:1-10).

I had learned in my intensive, almost night-and-day study of the Sabbath question that we are commanded also to keep the seven annual Holy Days.

**I DID NOT KNOW WHY!** I knew only that God said **"DO IT!"** My wife and I did — alone! For seven years!

**Parent Philadelphia church kept them**

It was not until God used me in raising up the first and parent church of this "Philadelphia era" (Revelation 3:7-13) that they joined with us in keeping these days. At first we kept only the seven annual Sabbaths. It was yet another seven years before God revealed to me THE REAL MEANING OF THESE DAYS — and that we should keep the entire Feast of Tabernacles — seven days plus the final eighth day, a Holy Day.

For 14 years we kept these *annual* days holy BECAUSE WE SAW THAT GOD COMMANDED IT. We wanted to obey!

In due time God revealed to me, and I to the Church, WHY! And even then many in the Church refused to keep more than the Holy Days!

And I feel many observing these Festivals today do it because the Church does but do not fully understand WHY — the REAL MEANING and God's PURPOSE in commanding them.

I think of the millions observing Christmas, New Year's, Easter, etc. — days that have NO REAL MEANING. God's days have MEANING, and this MEANING God wants us to understand. That's why they are repeated yearly.

You need to understand what went before. Again I repeat: It's like tuning in on a movie in the last 10 or 15 minutes of it. Not having seen what went before — what led up to it — WHAT IT'S ALL ABOUT — you can't understand what you see — you are CONFUSED — it's MEANINGLESS!

**Angels first**

At this point I deem it necessary to repeat a VERY BRIEF condensation of the material beginning on page 1. But read it here, to have it fresh in mind.

Few know it, but God placed angels on earth long before He created the first man and woman. They were spirit beings, composed of spirit — not matter. This earth was

to be their PROVING GROUND.

We need to understand that CHARACTER, either good or bad, cannot be instantly created by fiat. It must be developed by experience over a space of TIME. So God created angels with MINDS that could have knowledge, could THINK, reason, come to conclusions, make decisions. God told them of HIS GOVERNMENT which He set over them. To achieve God's PURPOSE — eventually to finish the creation of the entire UNIVERSE — it was necessary that they all pull together, in harmony and unity. His GOVERNMENT WAS THE WAY to provide that — and also the WAY to develop in them holy, righteous and perfect CHARACTER!

God set a superarchangel, the cherub LUCIFER, on the throne of the earth over the angels — probably a third of all the angels. *Even the creation of the angels was not complete until CHARACTER, good or evil, had been SET in them.* That required their thinking, reasoning and final decisions as to whether they would choose GOD'S way, which for brevity I call "GIVE," or the evil way, of "GET."

GOD'S GOVERNMENT is based on His LAW — the way of "GIVE." It is the way of LOVE. It is GIVING first of all a return of the LOVE of GOD which God gives His creatures — giving it in obedience, reverence, worship, walking in fellowship with God, in a close contact with God.

But Lucifer led the angels into the opposite way of "GET." This is the way of vanity, lust and greed, jealousy, envy, competition, strife, violence, destruction, resentment and bitterness and rebellion against God and His authority over them.

The angels SINNED (II Peter 2:4). They SET their character as EVIL. Lucifer is disqualified to administer the GOVERNMENT OF GOD, but his jurisdiction was the entire earth, and God would not remove him TILL a Successor QUALIFIED to RESTORE the GOVERNMENT OF GOD on earth, and also had been INDUCTED INTO OFFICE.

**God to reproduce Himself!**

This left God (Hebrew *Elohim*, including GOD and THE WORD, who also was God and later became Jesus Christ — John 1:1-14). The uniplural god (*Elohim*) was the ONLY being who could be relied upon never to violate the law of GOD'S GOVERNMENT — for it is IMPOSSIBLE for God to sin.

Now came the MOST STUPIDOUS, AWESOME PROJECT OF ALL!

God would REPRODUCE HIMSELF! He would do this through creating MAN in His own image, but out of matter. Spirit cannot be changed. But matter could be *changed* from the "GET" way to the "GIVE" way. This required repentance to be granted by God, and the human repenting, and with God's help CHANGING to GOD'S character. After this, mortal man could, by a resurrection, be changed to SPIRIT composition, with holy, righteous, perfect CHARACTER, made then IMPOSSIBLE ever to sin — born a child of GOD! WHAT A FANTASTIC, AWESOME PROJECT!

Angelic sin had wrought great devastation to the earth (Genesis 1:2 — Hebrew *tohu* and *bohu*, really mean-

ing waste, empty, decay), and I think it is indicated this same state of waste and decay occurred simultaneously to all planets in the universe, since they were LUCIFER'S potential jurisdiction.

So in six days God RENEWED (Psalm 104:30) the face of the earth for occupation by MAN.

The earth was formed of MATTER. God formed MAN of the dust of the ground. WHY? Because, as explained above, matter is subject to CHANGE — spirit is NOT. Once a spirit being is CREATED, he is immortal — changeless — can never be changed. Lucifer's and his angels' creation was not completed until they made their decision, choosing which CHARACTER they would SET in them, good or evil. They chose evil and can NEVER CHANGE.

LUCIFER'S name was changed to SATAN the DEVIL. The angels that sinned became DEMONS.

But now, once again, in renewing its face God made the earth BEAUTIFUL. He created fish life, bird life, animal life — each after its own KIND — then said, "Let us [not ME] make MAN in our image, after our likeness . . ." In other words, after the GOD kind — GOD WAS REPRODUCING HIMSELF.

That meant ultimately to produce beings LIKE HIM, actually BORN of HIM — in His FAMILY, and He, GOD, was to become the FATHER of the divine FAMILY, each born of Him, becoming one of His CHILDREN.

For the formation of CHARACTER, man must have MIND — capability — as had the angels, to KNOW, to THINK, to REASON, to COME TO CONCLUSIONS, to MAKE CHOICES AND DECISIONS.

To give mortal human MAN this MIND power, God put a human spirit in every man which imparts INTELLECT to the human brain. A number of animals have BRAINS of larger or smaller size — otherwise approximately equal to human brain — EXCEPT they lack spirit to impart powers of INTELLECT.

But this human spirit does NOT SEE — the BRAIN sees through the eyes. The BRAIN hears through the ears. Knowledge may be stored in the human spirit, working as a COMPUTER to supply instant recall for THINKING. But the spirit is NOT the MAN — only something ADDED to him. It is capable of receiving and storing knowledge only through the human BRAIN and therefore is CONFINED to PHYSICAL KNOWLEDGE ONLY. The spirit does NOT impart human LIFE. The LIFE resides in the BLOOD, and is oxidized and keeps the man alive by breathing AIR — the "BREATH OF LIFE."

BUT — one of the WONDERS of the mighty GOD — this human spirit was made to NEED ANOTHER SPIRIT TO JOIN WITH IT — the HOLY SPIRIT OF GOD. This is the very LIFE of God — immortal, divine God life. Once a man receives God's HOLY SPIRIT as God's GIFT, he is BEGOTTEN (not yet born) as a CHILD OF GOD. He becomes an HEIR — not yet an inheritor — of God.

But God's HOLY SPIRIT, imparted to man, joins with his human spirit. ("The Spirit [God's] itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God" [Romans 8:16].) The HOLY SPIRIT adds power to comprehend — to UNDERSTAND

— spiritual knowledge and spiritual principles, which carnal man with ONLY the human spirit cannot know.

"For what MAN knoweth the things of a man [unknown to animals], save [by] the spirit of man which is in him? *even so* the things of God knoweth no man, but [by] the Spirit of God" (I Corinthians 2:11).

The Holy Spirit imparts spiritual UNDERSTANDING, the LOVE of God, the FAITH of Christ and POWER to overcome.

In the Garden of Eden were two trees. One was the "tree of life," which symbolized the Holy Spirit. Adam NEEDED this Spirit, beside the human spirit already created in him. God offered it freely. But Adam had to make a CHOICE. Also in the midst of the garden was the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. To take of it was to REJECT GOD'S HOLY SPIRIT — GOD LIFE, God's divine LOVE to fulfill God's law, spiritual knowledge of good and evil — deciding FOR THEMSELVES what is right and what is wrong — whereas GOD'S LAW defines that — and the tree of LIFE also symbolized GOD'S LAW and GOD'S GOVERNMENT, which Satan had rejected.

In effect, Adam said to God, after being instructed by Him and tempted and misled by Satan, "I choose to go MY OWN WAY — to DECIDE FOR MYSELF what is right and what is wrong. I want to be free to DO AS I PLEASE — not bound by and obedient to your LAW. I want to RULE MYSELF — I reject YOU as ruler over me."

As the fountainhead of the entire human family, he thereby CUT ALL HUMANITY OFF FROM GOD — CUT HUMANITY OFF from access to the HOLY SPIRIT and any contact with GOD.

God then sentenced him and the human family to 6,000 years of being CUT OFF from contact with God. God adopted a 6,000-year "hands-off" policy toward human affairs.

In effect, God said, "Go, form your OWN governments, your OWN religions, your OWN forms of education, knowledge, production, your OWN society and civilization."

Adam probably did not realize it, and MAN, since, has NOT realized it, BUT SATAN has been subtly working in the minds of all humanity, swaying humanity HIS way — "the way of 'GET'" (Ephesians 2:2; II Corinthians 4:13).

But — after the 6,000-year trial, TO PROVE that the way of "GET" leads only to unhappiness, discontent, sorrow, pain and suffering, disease and frustration and DEATH — God's MASTER PLAN called for 1,000 years of the RULE of THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD and the establishment of the KINGDOM OF GOD.

God reserved the prerogative of intervening at any time He deemed necessary for His ultimate PURPOSE — to REPRODUCE HIMSELF and HIS PERFECT, HOLY, RIGHTEOUS CHARACTER in humans, changed FROM the "GET" to the "GIVE" way and finally made immortal.

**Where the Holy Days come in**

Now, HERE'S where the annual HOLY DAYS and FESTIVALS picture to GOD'S people annually GOD'S MASTER PLAN for working out HIS PURPOSE here below!

Up to this point I have given you the BACKGROUND without which you

simply CANNOT fully understand the annual Festivals. So here, in order, are God's HOLY FESTIVALS!

(I)

THE PASSOVER. This first Festival is NOT a Holy Day or annual Sabbath, but a Festival nevertheless. It reminds us annually that Christ died for our sins — for ALL have sinned — and His death paid our penalty in our stead. Jesus was God as well as MAN. God was His only Father. He was begotten in the womb of Mary, not by a male human, but by God the Father through the Holy Spirit. Thus He was able, even though tempted like all other humans — actually far worse — for He had to meet Satan head on in spiritual combat, to overcome Satan and QUALIFY to restore the GOVERNMENT OF GOD ON THIS EARTH. Until He had qualified, the assurance of the KINGDOM OF GOD to replace Satan's invisible rule over mankind could not be announced.

At this point it might be well to explain HOW Satan has ruled MAN. He did not say to Eve, through whom he caused Adam to sin, "Choose MY government, based on 'GET' instead of God's government based on 'GIVE.'" He led her, and through her Adam, to believe they were simply setting out ON THEIR OWN, deciding for themselves what is right and what is wrong, actually setting up their own human rule. So man has actually believed ever since. He has been deceived. He does not know Satan is his real ruler.

**HOW Satan sways man**

Satan is subtle. He DECEIVES. A deceived person does not know he is deceived — that he is wrong. He thinks he is RIGHT! Satan has DECEIVED THE WHOLE WORLD (Revelation 12:9).

**HOW?**

Satan is a SPIRIT being. He is the prince of the POWER of the AIR (Ephesians 2:2). I told you about the human spirit in every human. When God wanted to communicate with Cyrus, king of Persia, to move him to send out a proclamation to move a contingent of captive Jews back to Jerusalem to build the second Temple, "the ETERNAL stirred up the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia, that he made a proclamation throughout all his kingdom . . ." (Ezra 1:1), saying God had charged him to have this Temple built. God moved Cyrus through Cyrus' human spirit to do His will.

Likewise, Satan, a powerful spirit being next to God in power, and prince of the power of the air, is the SPIRIT "that now worketh in the children of disobedience" — that is, all humanity. I could not have understood that until I myself began BROADCASTING by radio and television. Every human spirit is TUNED IN ON HIS WAVELENGTH. He does not broadcast in words or music or pictures. You hear no sound. He broadcasts in ATTITUDES — attitudes of vanity, lust and greed, envy and jealousy, the spirit of competition, strife, bitterness and anger, hatred, violence, rebellion against GOD.

Thus he is the god of this world, who has been able to have "blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ . . . should shine unto them" (II Corinthians 4:4). Yes, he is the god of this world's many religions. They know not the TRUE GOD.

so has Satan continued to RULE THE WORLD, still on the throne of the earth where God placed him when his name was LUCIFER. It is so cleverly done man thinks he is ruling himself.

# Members parade 'Plain Truth' after floating over obstacles

BELFAST, Northern Ireland — A float promoting *The Plain Truth* was part of a parade seen by 75,000 people who lined the streets of Belfast May 14. "Civic pride" was the theme for the parade, called the Lord Mayor's Show. *The Plain Truth's* float's message: "Civic Pride Begins at Home."

Church members had labored to construct the float. Using a 30-foot flatbed trailer, they constructed a display showing the contrast between an unhappy, unstable home and a happy, close-knit family.

### Seesaw seen

"Planning and building of the float turned out to be a seesaw of unexpected events indicating a powerful influence was against it from the start," said Morris McCabe, one of the members who helped build it. "Yet all worked out well in the end, which proved God wanted it to be in the show."

Mr. McCabe said one of the workers "was miraculously saved from possible death when a ton of wood fell on him at work. Fortunately he fell between two piles of window frames, which saved him from being crushed."

Another worker "got a steel splinter in his eye, which put him out of action for the vital last few days when we were putting it all together. "Our two painters had bombs ex-

plode in their place of work. One, being only 20 yards away, was thrown backwards.

"The member helping transport material suddenly had a recurrence of an illness, which badly handicapped him, and the father of the local pastor, Mr. D. [David] Bedford, died two days before the show."

Other key workers had their problems as well, Mr. McCabe said. "In fact, just about everyone involved in the preparation had some abnormal, extraordinary event occur in their life during those three or four weeks.

"A general strike hit the whole province, causing widespread disruption resulting in discrimination and death, and it looked like the show would be postponed. It actually ended on the morning of the show, giving all a feeling of relief and an air of festivity."

But, in spite of the spate of problems, preparations for the show went on, and "the finishing touches were still being added as the float was being driven away."

### Right person and time

Things didn't always go badly; the weather was cooperative, and replacement workers turned up when others could not continue.

"It was really remarkable how the right person turned up for the job at the right time," Mr. McCabe said.

"God also led us to a local firm

that supplied cab, trailer and driver free of charge, saving the church nearly 100 pounds."

Robin Morrow, the public-relations officer for the Belfast church's project, feels he made "many valuable contacts with business and civic leaders" because of the float.

Belfast members didn't win a prize this year in the float competition, but were "in the judging till the final round," Mr. McCabe said.

"Overall the project proved a worthwhile venture, one which, perhaps, other church areas could undertake, and certainly one which the Northern Ireland churches are already thinking about for 1978."

Most noncommemorative stamps, regardless of country of origin, are valued by the pound. It is obvious that it takes many stamps to make a pound.

We found that it is not profitable to collect stamps from such a small group of people.

The main point learned: Get advice from an authority in your area.

About a year ago the Portland East church decided to upgrade its outdated library. Voluntary contributions of \$1 a month were asked from each family that could afford it.

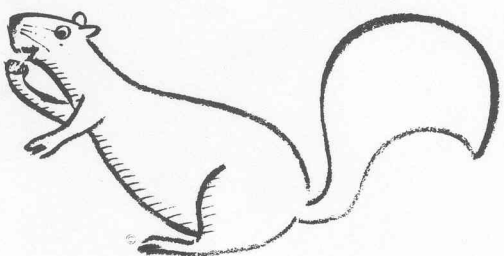

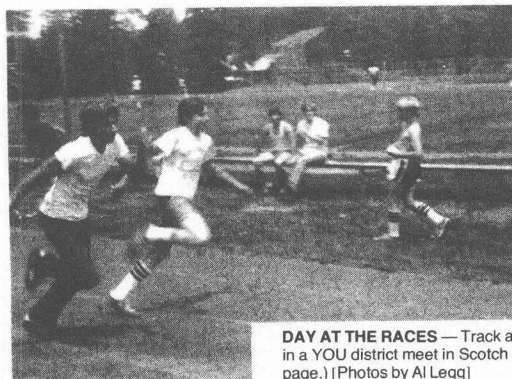

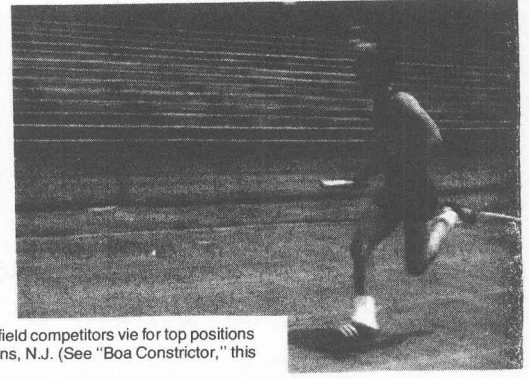

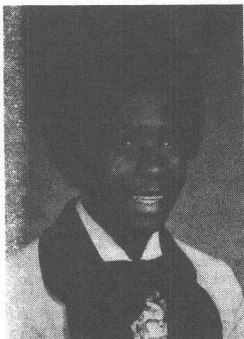

awarded a certificate for being the "Best Well-Mannered Student in the Fifth Grade" of the Whitesville, W.Va., school.

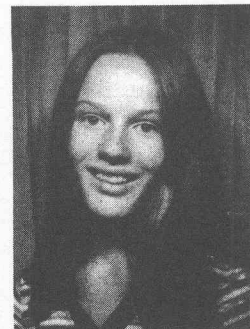
The certificate was signed by his teacher, Mrs. Donna Bailey, and principal C.W. Hoffman.

## Members' first film is a real shoot-out

MELBOURNE, Australia — The Melbourne Film Club's first motion picture has just completed its premier run. A western spoof of 12 minutes titled *Slaughter at Dixon's Creek*, it has been seen in all Melbourne congregations of the Church.

Part of its reputed success, no doubt, is that the antihero of the film, Dirty Dick Dean, is the pastor at Melbourne South, Rod Dean. This may be part of the reason the film left them rolling in the aisles

when it was shown at the Australian ministerial conference earlier this year in Burleigh Heads.

The production is the brainchild of producer, director, scriptwriter and head cameraman Paul Hasankolli, a member here, and involved about 20 young people all day one Sunday.

Filmed on location at the churches' Bushwalking Club site, at rural Yarra Glen, the set is as convincing as any western's. Depicting the eternal triangle, the plot in-

volves the seductive Lucky Lorraine (Lorraine Alter), whose love-at-first-sight romance with the un-gainly good guy, the Loco Kid (your reporter, Leon Lyell), is interrupted by the appearance of her old boy friend, the malevolent Dirty Dick Dean.

Terror bursts upon the barroom. With nearly everyone dead and Dick and Loco out of bullets, there is only one solution: a shoot-out next day on Main Street.

Deciding on the ending was dif-

ficult for the director, who didn't want to follow precedent but at the same time didn't want to show evil victorious. In the tense culmination of the walk down Main Street:

- The Loco Kid shoots himself in the foot.

- Dirty Dick raises his gun and grimaces.

- Lucky Lorraine races out to protect her pained hero.

If there is a lesson in the film it is that it doesn't pay to be mean. It also doesn't pay to be stupid.

Adam fell before Satan's subtlety, the second Adam chose the "GIVE" way and conquered Satan, qualifying to RESTORE THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD.

Just a few words at this point of events between the first and second Adam. God must have revealed some truth and His PURPOSE and PLAN to a few, from the time of Adam and Eve. Abel was called righteous by Jesus. Enoch walked with God. Noah was perfect, not only in his generations (ancestry), but in obedience to God. God spoke direct to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and blessed whatever Joseph did.

Then God intervened in this world's affairs by miraculously leading the slave descendants of Abraham out of Egypt. And God began revealing His truth in WRITING through Moses, who wrote the first five books of the Bible. And here we find the first record of the annual Holy Day Festivals. Yet we must put Leviticus 23 and the other sparse notices of the Festivals with other scriptures, as I am here doing, to perfectly UNDERSTAND THEM and their REAL MEANING.

God called Israel, NOT for spiritual salvation, but as a carnal people of THIS WORLD, to whom He could reveal certain knowledge and laws, and test their willingness to obey — to demonstrate that, WITHOUT the Holy Spirit, the natural mind of man is wholly carnal (physical, material, fleshy).

God gave His Holy Spirit ONLY to the prophets of His own choosing for the purpose of doing GOD'S WORK as assigned to them.

The Passover commemorates the Passover night in Egypt, when the death angel flew over Egypt, killing the firstborn in every house where the BLOOD (lamb's) was not on the side posts and upper doorpost of the houses. The Israelites killed and ate roast lamb that night — a type of the crucifixion of Christ, called the Lamb of God.

Therefore the MEANING of Passover is to remind us yearly of Christ's death in payment of the penalty of our sins. But Christ's DEATH does not save us, by imparting ETERNAL LIFE. It merely RECONCILES US TO GOD. Those so reconciled are no longer CUT OFF from God. Through Christ they have been restored to CONTACT with God, who has eternal life to GIVE. Read Romans 5:8-10. We are finally SAVED by HIS RESURRECTION, not His death. The "blood of Christ" is the START toward eternal life, not the completion of it.

## (II)

Now we come to the SECOND Festival — the SEVEN DAYS of UNLEAVENED BREAD. Remember, the first step is coming to Christ and ac-

cepting His shed blood as payment for our sins.

But Jesus said plainly, "NO MAN CAN COME TO ME, EXCEPT THE FATHER WHICH HATH SENT ME DRAW HIM" (John 6:44). THE WORLD IS CUT OFF FROM GOD. The only way to reestablish contact with God (the Father) is through CHRIST. And except the FATHER DRAW HIM, by means of His Holy Spirit, NO MAN CAN COME TO CHRIST.

Jesus selected and directly called His disciples. "Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you" (John 15:16). Jesus said.

ONLY THOSE SPECIALLY CHOSEN (predestinated) BY THE FATHER could, in the day of Jesus and the apostles, come to Christ. So it has been through this Church age; GOD IS NOT TRYING, NOW, to get the world saved. Rather, we are STILL in the 6,000-year time when MAN IS CUT OFF FROM GOD. AND GOD IS DRAWING TO CHRIST ONLY THOSE PREDESTINATED (CHOSEN) BY GOD!

IT WAS GOD'S PURPOSE THAT MAN should write the lesson in human experience, that the "GET" way leads only to unhappiness, discontent, suffering, frustration, destruction — and DEATH! Man has WRITTEN that lesson in human anguish, but HAS NOT YET LEARNED IT! God is going to PROVE, once and for all time, that only HIS WAY and HIS GOVERNMENT can produce PEACE and HAPPINESS and things GOOD!

Now, for those predestinated and CALLED, and DRAWN to Christ by the Father, the Feast of Unleavened Bread pictures PUTTING SIN OUT OF OUR LIVES. Leaven puffs up, as does vanity and sin. It is a type of sin — not wrong in itself, but putting all leaven out of our dwellings for seven days pictures putting the "GET" way out of our lives — turning from "GET" to "GIVE." This is the BEGINNING of BUILDING INTO OUR LIVES HOLY, RIGHTEOUS, PERFECT GODLY CHARACTER.

Seven is the number that denotes COMPLETENESS. So it means complete change.

Also, it begins the 15th day of God's sacred year, first month, NISAN, the anniversary of the day the Israelites started out of Egypt BY NIGHT. Egypt also is a type of SIN.

The first of these days and the seventh are annual HOLY Sabbaths.

## (III)

The THIRD annual Festival is PENTECOST, so called because of its use in Acts 2:1. It MEANS "count 50." This one Feast God leaves it to us to COUNT for ourselves, beginning WITH the morning after the Sabbath during the Festival of Unleavened Bread. Forty-five years ago I checked with every translation into English of the Bible, and every translation of that time said count 50 FROM the Sunday following the

weekly Sabbath during the seven-day Festival. Two or three years ago we discovered — and I forced men on the committee that translated the RSV to admit that it is a misleading translation to those who speak only English and are not familiar with Hebrew usage — that it should be translated "on" or "beginning on."

Originally this Feast was called Feast of Firstfruits, because it portrayed the very FIRST spiritual harvest of God's begotten children.

All seven Festivals were based on the annual MATERIAL harvest in the "Holy Land." There were the two harvests yearly — the first the early grain harvest, early summer; the main harvest being the fall harvest, with four Festivals coming in the seventh month of the sacred calendar. Thus, the annual Festivals use the MATERIAL harvest to picture the SPIRITUAL.

## FIRST group to receive Holy Spirit

REMEMBER, Adam cut mankind off from God. Man must have CONTACT WITH GOD THE FATHER to receive the Holy Spirit. The "tree of life" in the Garden of Eden meant God freely offered Adam — and his children, which form humanity — the Holy Spirit, but Adam had to make a CHOICE between that and the tree of knowledge of good and evil. The tree of life represented God's Holy Spirit and the "GIVE" way of life. The other tree represented Satan's "GET" way of life. Adam chose, for the human race, the "GET" way. Then God drove man (representing humanity) FROM the Garden of Eden, "lest he . . . take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live forever" (Genesis 3:22-24).

True, God Himself gave Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and the prophets His Spirit for SPECIAL PURPOSES and to enable them to do the WORK He assigned to them — of His own choosing.

Otherwise none can come to the Father but through CHRIST. And Jesus said plainly, "NO MAN CAN COME TO ME, EXCEPT THE FATHER WHICH HATH SENT ME DRAW HIM" (John 6:44).

It is PLAIN, then, that spiritual salvation was CLOSED to all humanity, except those I have mentioned, until after Christ's ascension to heaven.

Jesus had said to His disciples on the eve of His crucifixion, "But now I go my way to him that sent me . . . It is expedient for YOU that I go away: for if I go not away, the Comforter [Holy Spirit] will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you" (John 16:5-7).

It was on the Day of Pentecost, 50 days after Passover week, that the Holy Spirit CAME and entered into those of the CHURCH — numbering 120. It was the FIRST TIME there was any spiritual GROUP salvation. It

was the day the CHURCH OF GOD was begotten. Three thousand more were ADDED. These were those God had CALLED — had been predestinated to be called THEN and not in the Millennium, when EVERYBODY LIVING will be called.

On that day Peter, now inspired by the Holy Spirit, said, "For the PROMISE [of the Holy Spirit] is unto you, and to your children . . . even as many as the Lord our God shall call" (Acts 2:39). And in verse 47, "And the LORD added to the church daily such as should be saved." The apostles did not go out soliciting converts — God CALLED them — it was GOD and not the apostles who ADDED to the Church.

A day or two later 2,000 more were added. Then for a very short while the Church membership MULTIPLIED. But soon the persecution SCATTERED the converts, and the growth apparently diminished. Soon the true Gospel was SUPPRESSED. It's possible the Church membership is the LARGEST today it has ever been. For the PURPOSE of the Church is:

1) To stand back of the apostles in prayers, tithes and offerings in getting the GOSPEL ANNOUNCED to the WORLD — and it's a BIGGER WORLD to be reached today.  
2) To DEVELOP HOLY, RIGHTEOUS AND PERFECT CHARACTER in those called and to sit with Christ on His throne when He comes to rule the world and to be given power to RULE the WORLD.

So REALIZE THIS! Pentecost is to remind us every year that we (the Church) are only the FIRST small harvest of God's calling people for salvation OUT OF A WORLD WHOLLY, except for us, CUT OFF FROM GOD, AND HAS BEEN SINCE ADAM! THE WORLD as a whole is still CUT OFF!

We are those who have been PREDESTINATED to be called NOW!

We have been called to receive the HOLY SPIRIT. WHAT IS the Holy Spirit? It is that second Spirit man needs to go with the human spirit in every human. It is the impregnation of GOD LIFE, which makes us HIS CHILD NOW, even though only begotten and not yet BORN — an HEIR, not yet an INHERITOR — begotten into the GOD FAMILY.

It is the Spirit of UNDERSTANDING, imparting to the physical brain SPIRITUAL INTELLECT, ability to comprehend SPIRITUAL knowledge. It is the LOVE of God placed within us — divine LOVE. It is the FAITH of CHRIST, the same FAITH with which Jesus performed His miracles, now given to us — placed within us. It is also spiritual POWER to overcome. The spiritual POWER to help us turn from and resist the "GET" way and turn to the "GIVE" way.

It is the POWER by which we may develop the HOLY, RIGHTEOUS, PERFECT CHARACTER, which is GOD'S

PURPOSE for having PUT humanity on the earth — that GOD MAY THUS REPRODUCE HIMSELF!

## (IV)

First of the AUTUMN Festivals is the FEAST OF TRUMPETS, on the first day of the seventh month, sacred calendar. This represents the COMING OF CHRIST IN SUPREME ALMIGHTY POWER AND GLORY to set up the KINGDOM OF GOD, to RESTORE THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD.

## (V)

The fifth Festival is another one-day HOLY DAY — the FAST DAY — picturing the putting away of SATAN, since his Successor has not only QUALIFIED (more than 1,900 years ago), but now IS INDUCTED INTO OFFICE. AT LAST the world is rid of Satan — at one with God.

## (VI)

On the 15th day of the seventh month begins the FEAST OF TABERNACLES — the MILLENNIUM — the time of the physical FALL HARVEST in Jerusalem and environs and the time when ALL THEN LIVING SHALL BE CALLED and given the chance to repent, believe and receive salvation. This Feast lasts SEVEN DAYS, with the first day an annual Sabbath.

## (VII)

This is followed, the very next day, by a HOLY DAY, picturing the GREAT WHITE THRONE JUDGMENT — the time when ALL who ever lived and were not CALLED shall be RESURRECTED MORTAL, just as they were — human flesh and blood. They will be able to see and KNOW the results of the 6,000 years of the "GET" way of man, cut off from God, as well as the 1,000 years of the "GIVE" way under Christ. They will every one be "CALLED" — given opportunity to REPENT and BELIEVE and receive the Holy Spirit and eternal life in the KINGDOM OF GOD!

That concludes the Festivals of God. They vividly picture His MASTER PLAN. All that remains will be the resurrection of those that WERE CALLED but, like Lucifer, rejected the call and the KINGDOM OF GOD! They shall go into the LAKE OF FIRE — the second death for each — to become ashes under the soles of our feet and all memory of them blotted from our minds.

On beyond this, we, the GOD FAMILY, BILLIONS of us, all of us possessing HOLY, RIGHTEOUS AND PERFECT CHARACTER, all of us UNABLE TO SIN, shall then go on and COMPLETE the BEAUTIFICATION AND CREATION OF THE ENTIRE VAST UNIVERSE, constantly looking forward in joyous anticipation and ecstasy to still GREATER and more marvelous and awesome things to go throughout the whole endless UNIVERSE — always looking back on supreme and glorious accomplishments that only an ALMIGHTY GOD could do!

And THAT is the awesome human POTENTIAL!

MORE than one Person). It is a plural name, like "family" or "group" or "church." In John 1:14 it is stated that "the word" was, much later than in verse 1, made flesh — became Jesus Christ, born of a human mother, therefore HUMAN but sired by GOD — therefore also GOD. He was the "ONLY-begotten" — therefore the only human so sired by God.

The earth was created PERFECT, including many properties such as gravity, inertia, force, energy, all the elements known by the sciences of physics and chemistry, with which much could be done.

are coming to believe."

## No one willing to know

And that authority is no less than the Bible — which almost NOBODY knows, primarily because almost no one is willing to know. As adman Bruce Barton said, it is "the Book that NOBODY knows."

But you COULD prove it true, accurate and positively AUTHENTICATIVE — and the ONLY explanation of our world that makes sense! Read on, and tell me of ANYTHING ELSE that makes any sense at all!

The real beginning is not Genesis 1:1 — the first words in the Bible.

The real beginning is found in John 1:1-4, in the NEW Testament.

"In the beginning" — perhaps trillions times trillions of years ago, in actual fact longer ago than your mind can conceive — "was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." It is speaking of two supernatural, almighty Personages. Not humans. Not composed of matter — for there was NO MATTER then. There was nothing but endless SPACE and these two supreme Beings, composed of Spirit, who had ALWAYS existed. "Always" is longer ago than your mind can conceive! So I suggest we do not try to conceive that — for there are some

things we simply are compelled to accept which our human minds are too limited to conceive — yet which we MUST accept, for there is no alternative.

I can have space here to give you merely the briefest outline or summary. Because to explain what I want you to know in any detail would take a book as large as Wells' Outline of History. But many of these details have appeared in other articles within the past three years.

These Two Superbeings possessed supreme minds and unlimited POWER to design, plan, produce, create whatever They in their supreme wisdom chose.

How long must They have devoted to THINKING and PLANNING before They actually began creating and producing?

They were of ONE MIND — that is, perfect AGREEMENT. God was supreme — over the WORD — in authority.

## First the angels

First They designed and created angels — composed of SPIRIT. There was NO MATTER in existence as yet. But now there were angels, beside "the word" and God!

Next in the Bible we come to Genesis 1:1 and Elohim (Hebrew, meaning ONE God consisting of

the campus in Pasadena.

Of course what I had hoped long ago was that perhaps at some time in the future the educational arm of the Church could be conducted on our Big Sandy campus, where we have almost unlimited space without the setback, height-requirement and various other building-code restrictions required by big urban-planning agencies, where we would be free to expand, design, fulfill our own integral master-plan specifications according to our own designs and build a college campus that would be exactly suitable to our needs.

We would be utterly unfettered by any space-requirement limitations, could allow the campus to grow as large or keep it as small as we wished and of course could provide the kind of an education and environmental setting that would be far more conducive to wholesome, constructive character building than is the immediate environment of a sprawling megalopolis such as the Los Angeles-Hollywood-Pasadena complex.

### The Vista the answer?

Obviously this was not to be, at least for the immediate present or the immediately foreseeable future. Our very large expenditure for the physical plant in Pasadena has ruled it otherwise. So, when it appeared the Vista del Arroyo property might come our way, it looked as if God had made this decision for us. Here was a magnificent building, sitting there vacant for a large number of years as if beckoning to Ambassador College. It led some of us to speculate that God had in His own mind intended the college to move into this facility all along.

Thus, when I asked more than one year ago for a study to be made as to the possibility of the consolidation of the two undergraduate, coeducational liberal-arts institutions on one campus, our study was aimed only toward the absorption of the Big Sandy undergraduate institution on the Pasadena campus.

Subsequent to the merger of the two campuses, I have asked our officials on both campuses to provide me with a study going the other direction, so that we may have other information based on 1977 dollars as to what would be the financial impact if, within the next two to five years or even farther into the future, we were to finally effect such a transition as I have outlined, namely, retaining the Pasadena campus as the headquarters of the Worldwide Church of God and the headquarters of the Ambassador International Cultural Foundation and operating the graduate school of theology, the school of business and, we hope at some time in the future, a school of law.

### Only a study

We would, in fact, be Ambassador University on two campuses, with full four-year, coeducational, liberal-arts courses taught on the Big Sandy campus. Mind you, this is only a study, only a projection, only a question about "what if?" It reflects no serious intent on anyone's part and will be simply put into the files upon its completion for future evaluation should any such exigencies arise.

Concurrent with this, I have also asked the same personnel to study the potential for the operation of a one-year senior-high boarding school on the Big Sandy campus; a three-year full high school as a boarding school; a college prep school; or a two-year junior college.

In other words, I want to leave no stone unturned in thinking of ways and means for the full utilization of

the large commitment to physical plant and grounds on the Big Sandy campus and to avoid, at all costs, allowing those fine facilities to gradually run downhill and to fall into disrepair and disuse.

Once again I dare to take all of you brethren fully into my confidence with regard to these highly speculative studies, preferring to do so to stifle various rumors that tend to get started.

### Back to accreditation

But back to accreditation. The major concerns of the commission are those which are the most obvious even to a Church member visiting Ambassador College for the first time. That is, it is very difficult to tell where the college begins and the Church leaves off, or where the Church begins and the college leaves off.

Some moves we are wanting to make are, therefore:

1. To set up, if it proves both desirable and necessary, a totally separate college accounting system with a separate college financial officer to further complete the process of the separation of the two entities.

2. To continue the process of the moving of all Church-related activities (such as editorial and the newsgathering service) from the Hall of Administration on the college campus to an interim solution (before the erection of a separate headquarters Church building) of taking up office spaces in the Office Facilities Complex opposite the freeway from the campus.

3. To conduct a search for qualified longtime lay members of the Church who are loyal, dedicated and competent people who can become members of the board of trustees, thus reflecting a higher representation from the lay membership of the Worldwide Church of God on the college board.

There are any number of other lesser recommendations, having nothing directly to do with governance or the composition of the board which the commission also gave us, but the ones which are most important are those I have stated.

### Acting in good faith

It is my earnest and sincere desire that we can show the commission we are acting in all good faith and proceeding with caution and discretion to bring about the fullest compliance with all those requirements of the commission which will lead us to regional accreditation, it is hoped, in the spring of 1978.

It is my hope and that of the full administration and faculty that we can show the commission that we have been functioning along these lines more closely to the requirements of the commission for a full six months by the time we request our next in-depth visit.

We were very pleased with the warm and cordial reception we were given, and most especially pleased that the leading members of the commission went out of their way to point out the amicable and cordial relationships between themselves and Ambassador College, mentioning on several occasions how thankful they were that ours is not an "adversary relationship" but a mutual desire on the part of all parties to see Ambassador College become what it truly should be, what it wants to be and what it hopes to be.

### Psyched myself down

As I told many people near me in the past few months, I was "psychoing myself down" with regard to accreditation, since I knew that some eleven-hour changes — such as the addition of a large number of new board members, the basic composition of the board, the faculty handbook, the consolidation of the two undergraduate programs and other matters — might have served to indicate a certain disequilibrium which

might influence some members of the commission adversely.

In short, I didn't want my hopes to be so high that I responded emotionally and descended into a feeling of gloom if accreditation were denied.

I have explained repeatedly that it is a process, that it is a learning and constructive process and that it is an ongoing process.

### New radio programs

I have been making new radio programs as fast as I can and was very pleased to receive a report on how well the mail is coming in, resulting from our new five-minute radio programs. I was very inspired by seeing the charts on mail go right out the top as a result of some of the new programs I have been making on the family, dating, Soviet rearmament and other subjects.

Also, I have been using some of our old-time, standard booklets for the Sunday programs and recently completed a full half-hour program, wading through the entire booklet *Where Are Enoch and Elijah?* and advertising it very heavily.

There is really GOOD NEWS coming from Mr. Richard Rice, director of subscriber services and our mail-processing area, who informed me and my father that we are experiencing an unusual upturn in prospective members!

Mr. Steve Martin, coordinator for the Church's Western Area, was telling me very enthusiastically that any number of our Southern California ministers have reported large upturns in the number of prospective members!

Of course, this is a sign of well-

being and of healthful growth which we are all very happy over!

Meanwhile as I know I told you in the past, we will be entering a period of "peaks and valleys" in our financial picture and, with another great round of thanksgiving for the outpouring of support you brethren have given us, let me urge you to KEEP IT UP, most especially through the latter summer months! Our indicators of the past have always tended to show that when our brethren's minds turn toward vacation and travel, with a general slowdown in business and commerce as a whole, the income for the Work always tends to slide into a severe "valley" and we find another cash-flow difficulty. I certainly hope we can all lock arms and prevent this from happening this year and not have to undergo a serious slump in the months of July and August just before the Feast!

### Sad news

All of us were very saddened to hear of the death of Dick Dickerson after a prolonged bout with cancer [see article, page 15]. His death was a deep emotional blow to his wife and three children and, of course, all the families and friends involved.

As I have said publicly out of the pulpit so many times recently, there is no more detestable disease than cancer, and it always seems to strike so suddenly, in both sexes and at all ages!

Mr. Benny Sharp, with whom I fly the Cessna Citation, was telling me the other day that just two short years ago he and Dick Dickerson won the Big Sandy rackets tournament together! So here is a young and vital

man, occupying an important faculty responsibility on the Big Sandy campus and seemingly in the peak of good health, in only a matter of months told by physicians that he has cancer.

I'm sure that all of you brethren will remember his loved ones and his family in your prayers.

### New addition for 'WN'

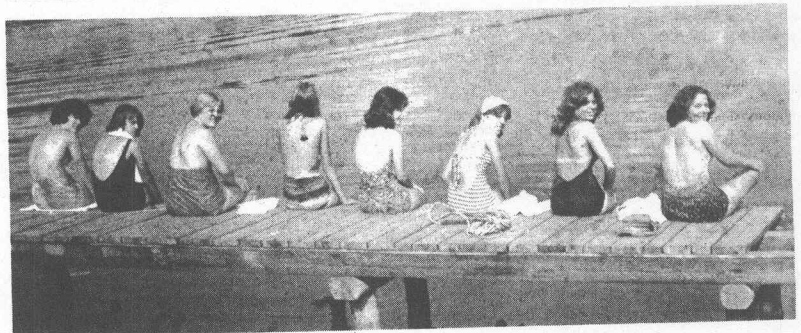

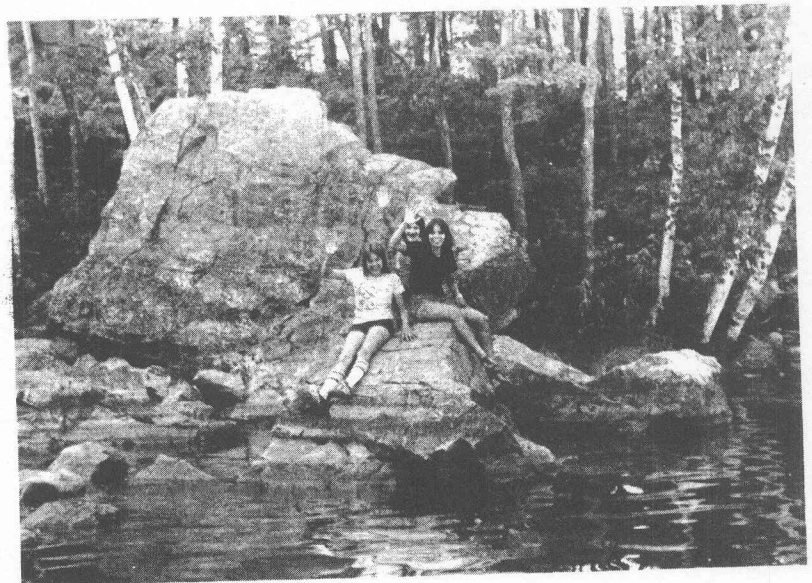
Shortly you will see a separate supplement, probably every other issue, included in these pages. We hope all of you brethren will find time to read the articles and get a great deal of good from them.

# YOU campers bounce the week away

**BIG SANDY** — Six days of basketballs bouncing all around you.

That's what 63 YOU boys went through June 19 to 24 during a Youth, Opportunities United-sponsored basketball camp for Church youths conducted here by Bill Sharman, general manager of the Los Angeles Lakers pro basketball team.

David Beebe, 15, who attends church in Austin, Tex., admits he got his fill of the sport while at the clinic. "At night all I can hear is boing, boing, boing," he said.

Assisted by Dan Yocum, head coach at Pepperdine University in Malibu, Calif., Jim Petty of Pasadena, Ambassador's athletic director, and 10 coaches from Texas colleges and high schools, Mr. Sharman instructed the campers in the fundamentals of basketball. Each camper participated in full-court games each day as well as practice

drills to sharpen the new skills they were learning.

Calvin Murphy, a basketball player for the Houston (Tex.) Rockets, also spoke to the boys, on dribbling and ball handling, the third day of the camp.

### Three regions

Coming from three YOU regions (Southeast, South Central and Mountain), about 30 of the boys had been given scholarships by YOU to come here.

Mr. Sharman was pleased with the way the camp went. "We hope to keep coming back each year," he said. He enjoys working with the younger basketball players. "It's fun to watch them as they progress through their careers."

Dan Yocum was impressed with the YOU boys. "We have some very fine lads here," he said. "I've worked many, many camps before, and these are the most polite kids, all very respectful of their coaches and fellow campers."

Larry Sorrells of New London, Tex., head basketball coach at West Rusk High School there, thinks the camp is "a good thing" for budding athletes. Ken Tate, YOU coordinator and basketball coach for the Harrison, Ark., church, was also one of the coaches for the camp and brought

YOU member Wayne Holmes, 18, from Harrison down for the clinic.

"I think it's a big benefit," Mr. Tate said. "I've watched Wayne improve already. There's so many things you're able to go over in the short period of time that you're here." He said the clinic also helped him in gaining practical experience in dealing with the boys.

Most of all, though, the campers benefited from the camp.

Mike Taylor, 18, of Nashville, Tenn., came to the camp so he could learn the basics and "pass it on to the younger ones back home."

Raynard Eddings, 15, of Denver, Colo., said playing on a team made up of boys with varied backgrounds in basketball is good because "you have to learn to work with the skills they each have."

### Camp casualty

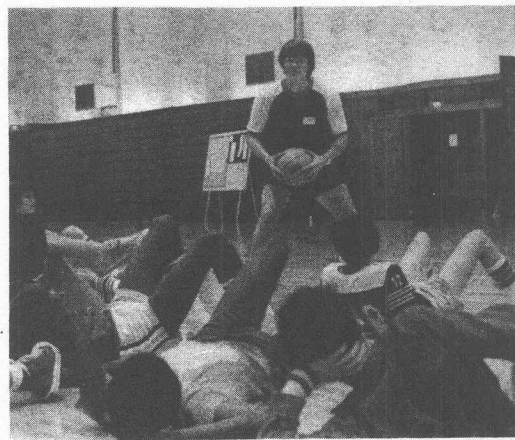
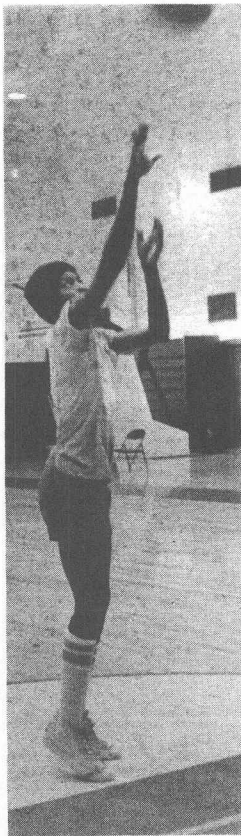

Two more camps are to be con-

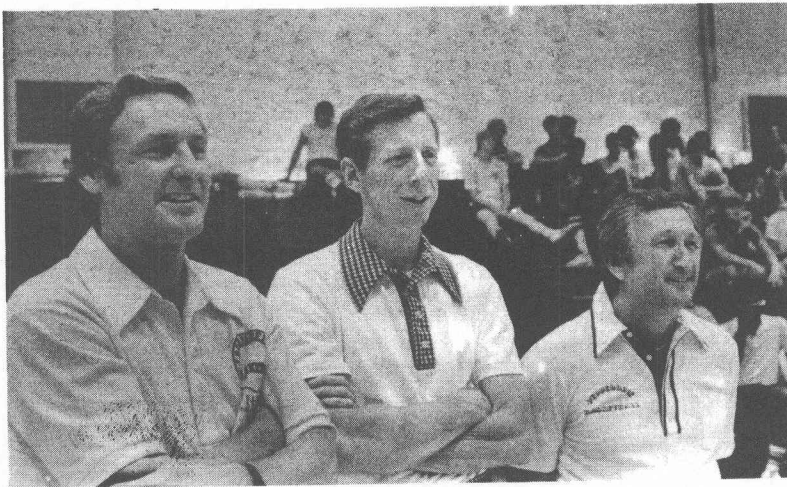
